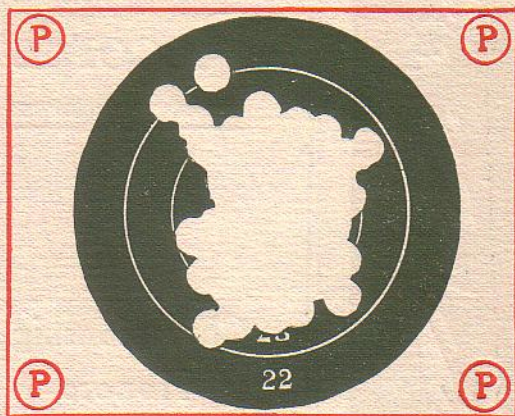

Composite Target, showing Mr. Ittel's Score of 2459, made with Peters .22 Short Cartridges.

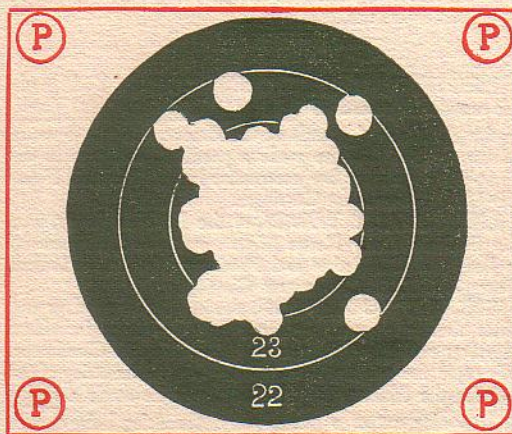
