### 280 REMINGTON RECEIVES NEW 140 GRAIN LOADING

In 1986, Remington will add a new, 140-grain pointed soft point bullet to its 280 Remington cartridge, a loading most ballisticians consider to be the optimum bullet weight for the 28 caliber.

Among many highly experienced and knowledgeable hunters, the 280 Remington has long been regarded as the best all-around choice in a medium-caliber, big game round. The addition of a 140-grain PSP bullet with a high ballistic coefficient will not only increase its versatility but will further improve its already outstanding downrange energy and trajectory.

A quick review of comparative ballistics with other, popular big game rounds provides practical support for the 280 Remington's excellent reputation. With the new, 140-grain loading, it delivers even flatter trajectory than the 270 Win. 130-grain load out to 500 yards with the advantage of a heavier bullet and a 12.5 percent to 20 percent increase in downrange energy.

In direct comparison with the popular 30-06, 150-grain PSP load, the 280 Remington, 140-grain combination provides superior trajectory throughout with a substantial advantage of 15 percent to 29 percent greater downrange energy.
